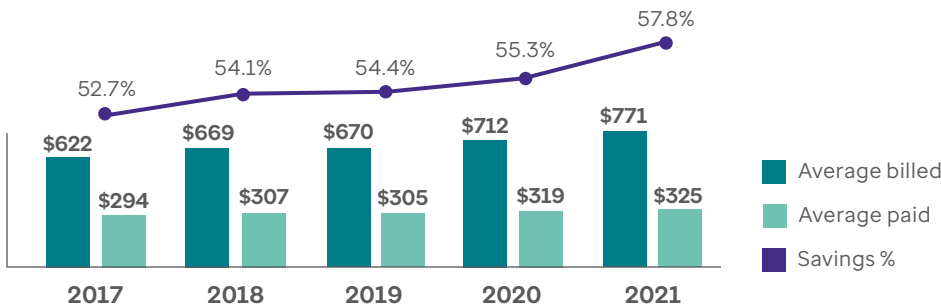
Centers of Excellence network

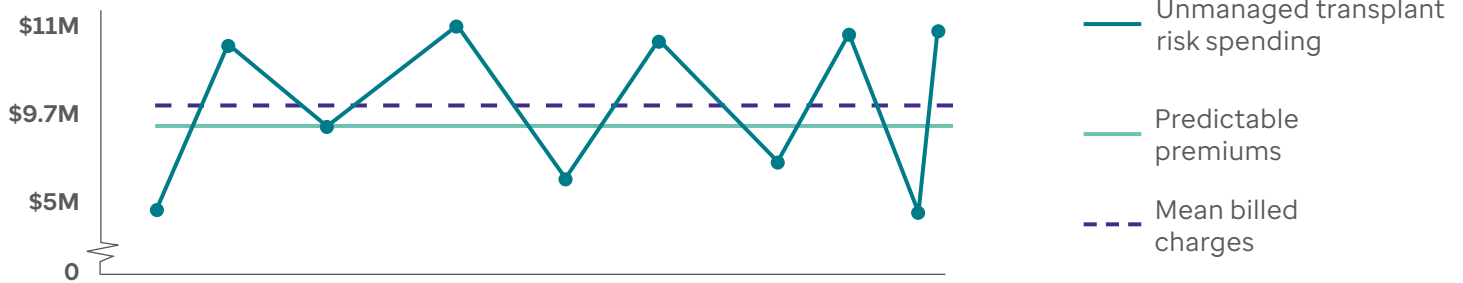
